#### **Biography of David Solomon**

David Solomon was born in California in 1925. He served in World War II and was pulled from combat and re-assigned to intelligence work after his two and only brothers were killed in bombing runs over Germany. He was discharged in 1946 and attended Washington Square College of New York University on the GI Bill; Solomon eventually earned his BA from Washington Square College. He remained in the Village, married and had two children. Solomon became an assistant editor at *Esquire* by the mid-1950s and worked with writers, such as Aldous Huxley, Jack Kerouac, William S. Burroughs and Allen Gingsberg. In 1960, he became editor of *Metronome* and was friends with Dizzy Gillespie, Nat Henthoff, Earl Robinson, and Perry Robinson. By the early 1960s, Solomon became the literary editor for *Playboy* and published the writings of Ram Das (Richard Alpert), Alan Watts, Timothy Leary and Humphry Osmond. He also edited *LSD –the Conscious Expanding Drug* (1964) and *The Marijuana* (1966) and co-edited *Drugs and Sexuality* (1973) and *The Coca Leaf and Cocaine Papers* (1975). On April 26, 2007, Solomon died at the age of 81.
